Since our last newsletter we have seen several things happen around Narok and at Nasha. Some things have been incredible, others we wish had never come, but in the midst of it all God teaches us. Here are a few of the lessons we've learned:

Everything in its time

It is overwhelming thinking about to do lists - people to see, things that need to get done, family responsibilities. However, one thing that God keeps bringing us back to is, "everything in its time." Do what you can and take time for rest.

He restores my soul

At the point of feeling discouraged, God sent His care. This summer we hosted Venture interns and others from JAARS, Ends of the Earth Cycling and YouthHope. We were blessed by and encouraged by the fresh enthusiasm the visits brought. They were able to contribute to fellowships, build a new church plant and be able to train several youth workers in three areas.

In August, we were encouraged by the Bluegrass Bike Ride. Eleven cyclists plus support staff set off from Lexington, KY in a 300-mile ride to help raise awareness and support for the youth of Kenya. Thank you to all who participated. The ride was a wonderful experience for all those who participated as they were pushed, strengthened, and encouraged each day. Joy comes in the morning

At times we go through trials to be able to experience God's joy in the end. God has placed us where we are for a purpose. Our goal is not to wish for something else, but to strive to follow Him in the midst of where we are. All of us are placed by God for a purpose: to live according to His word.

In April, Narok faced several flash floods that were devastating to the town. Dozens of lives and businesses were lost. The need was overwhelming as we saw Red Cross helicopters fly overhead to survey the damage. Stories of families who lost businesses or even children to the floods were heard each day. Although we were not able to do a large project as a ministry, we were able to see that several children were able to go back to school by providing school uniforms, sweaters, and school and hygiene supplies. Narok is still recovering from the damage but the community has come together. God calls us to be Jesus just where we are.

We are excited to start out the new school year with Jojo in 1st grade and Bellas in preschool, along with also starting Swahili lessons and Girl Scouts. The girls are gaining more confidence in Kenya and are more eager to serve in the community.
